

District 3 (Virginia, Arenzville, Beardstown, Jacksonville)

Jodine (Jodie) has represented members in District 3 for 10 years. She currently chairs the Bylaw/ Policy Committee and serves on the Irrigation and Labor Committees.

Jodie is a National Crop Insurance Training Manager for AgriSompo North America. She holds a bachelor's degree in Ag Business from Western Illinois University and a master's in Ag Economics from Colorado State University.

Warren Goetsch has served Menard Electric Cooperative members for the past 36 years and is currently President of our Board of Directors. Also, he represents





The Cooperative is a member of Prairie Power, Inc. (PPI) and under its wholesale power agreement. The Cooperative is committed to purchase its electric power and energy requirements from PPI until December 31, 2047. The rates paid for such purchases are subject to periodic review. This amounted to \$18,565,890 and \$17,673,201 for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, respectively. The amounts payable to PPI at December 31, 2022 and 2021 were \$2,654,232 and \$2,593,424, respectively.

Minutes of the Eighty-Fourth Annual Meeting of Menard Electric Cooperative

AUGUST 4, 2022

The Eighty-Fourth Meeting of the Members of Menard Electric Cooperative was held at PORTA High School in Petersburg, Menard County, Illinois, on Thursday, August 4, 2022, pursuant to legal notice duly given to the members of the Cooperative on the 11th day of July, 2022. The meeting was called to order by President D. Jay Frye at 7:00 o'clock P.M. (Central Daylight Time).

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by 2022 Menard Electric Cooperative scholarship recipients Ross Bodine and Ambyr Teimeyer, followed by the singing of the National Anthem by Haley Atwater of Petersburg, Illinois. Invocation was given by Pastor Nick Sutton, Buffalo Hart Presbyterian Church. General Manager Alisha Anker introduced guests in attendance at the Meeting. President Frye reviewed the proposed Agenda for conducting the Annual Meeting. He advised that there was one (1) change to the Agenda, which was to add Election of Directors following the Treasurer's Report. There being no objections to the Agenda as amended, it was approved and adopted. President Frye then appointed the Parliamentarian, Sergeant-at-Arms, and Vote Tellers.

Michael E. Patrick, Secretary of the Cooperative, was introduced by President Frye. Secretary Patrick read the Notice of the Meeting and the President thereupon declared proof that the Notice was sufficient and ordered the Notice and Certificate of Mailing filed with the minutes of the Meeting. Secretary Patrick reported that a quorum of members were present in person and/or by proxy. The President directed him, as Secretary, to annex to the minutes of the Meeting, a list of the members present and to file the proxies with the records of the Cooperative. It was thereupon moved and seconded that the reading of the Minutes of the 83rd Annual Meeting of August 5, 2021, be dispensed with and the Minutes be approved as recorded and published in the Annual Meeting Book. Motion carried.

Treasurer Dennis Ryan presented the Treasurer's Report. It was moved and seconded that the Treasurer's Report be approved as presented. Motion carried.

President Frye introduced Attorney Smith to conduct the election of Directors. Attorney Smith advised that for District #1, there was one (1) nominee that being Gary Holloway to serve for a three (3) year term. It was moved and seconded that a unanimous ballot be cast for Gary Holloway as Director for District #1 for a three (3) year term. Motion carried. Attorney Smith advised that for District #4, there was one (1) nominee that being Dennis Ryan to serve for a three (3) year term. It was moved and seconded that a unanimous ballot be cast for Dennis Ryan as Director for District #4 for a three (3) year term. Motion carried. Attorney Smith advised that for District #6, there was one (1) nominee that being Steve Worner to serve for a three (3) year term. It was moved and seconded that a unanimous ballot be cast for Steve Worner as Director for District #6 for a three (3) year term. Motion carried.

President Frye presented the President's Report.

General Manager Anker presented the General Manager's Report.

President Frye then called for new and unfinished business and answered questions from Members.

There being no further business to come before the Membership, it was moved and seconded the Meeting be adjourned. Motion carried.


