#### **BudgetWise Program**

**Budget Billing:** Pay the same amount every month. Your amount due is fixed at the average of your most recent 12 months. In November or June each year you will settle up with a credit if you used less than the estimated amount of electricity or a balance due if you used more.



Average Billing: Your bill will reflect the average of your most recent 12 months, rounded to the nearest \$5 increment. The amount due may fluctuate month-to-month. There is not a settlement month each year, the amount continually rolls forward.

# Kilo Watt



Who as a kid didn't hear mom say, "You're letting all the cold air out!" as you stood dumbfounded with the refrigerator door wide open looking for a snack salvation? Guilty. But the kid in me often thought, aren't I rather letting the warm air in. Either way you

> stack it up, this month we break down the energy usage of this precious keep-it-fresh appliance by comparing the U.S. Government's EnergyGuide consumer label for a 22.6 cu ft Samsung 4-dr French-door refrigerator with KiloWatt facts.

> This model is an "extra" we keep in the garage space, purchased new late last year. I struggled with the justification given EnergyGuide's label telling me it would cost approximately \$83/year for the 690 kilowatt-hours (kWh) of energy. That said, I succumbed and do find it useful - its doors and drawers get plenty of action. I keep the Fridge temp at a reasonable 40 degrees F, the FlexZone drawer at an economic 41 degrees F, and the much-used Freezer at 0 degrees F. The icemaker is kept ON and the dog assures me the water dispenser sees daily combat.

Surprisingly, throughout the test-month I was happy to discover the unit only drew an average of 1,030 watts (W) per day given the number of hot and muggy days we endured. This equates to only 376 kWh of energy usage in the year, more like an expected \$46/yr cost. I'm sold!!

Korner Recommendation: Don't fret over the "extra" garage fridge, but be wary of its energy efficiency – an older model could cost you more than the value of its convenience.
