October is Cooperative Month

This month more than 30,000 cooperatives across the U.S. are celebrating National Co-op Month.

Like all co-ops, we are guided by seven cooperative principles that embody the values and spirit of the cooperative movement.

- 1. Open and Voluntary Membership: Co-op membership is open and voluntary for those you wish to use the co-op's services.
- 2. Democratic Member Control: Members make decisions that shape the cooperative. Why? Because co-ops are created by the members, for the members.
- 3. Members'Economic Participation: Members contribute money to

the co-op to make sure it runs smoothly now and in the future.

- 4. Autonomy and Independence: Co-ops are independent and can operate on their own, which ultimately benefits the members.
- 5. Education, Training and Information: Co-ops continuously focus on education to ensure employees have the training and information they need.
- 6. Cooperation Among Cooperatives: Co-ops share with and learn from other cooperatives, and we help each other out in times of need.
- 7. Concern for Community: All cooperatives work for the greater good of the local communities they serve.

Fall to-do list for energy savings

ConnecT

- Schedule HVAC maintenance and change filters.
- Inspect fireplace chimneys, flues and dampers
- Cover drafty windows; consider using plastic window film and heavy drapes.
- Set fans to run clockwise in cool weather to circulate warm air.
- Seal out air leaks.
 - Check the weather-stripping and seals on all doors and windows. Try this trick: Shut windows/doors on a piece of paper, if you can pull the paper out without it tearing, air can probably get through. Many weatherstripping options are available.
 - Check all holes for pipes and faucets for gaps. Look for leaks at exterior corners, siding and chimney junctures; the joints between foundation and exterior brick or siding; and for cracks in the mortar, foundation or siding.
 - Consider using caulk for cracks under ¼ inch; consider if spray foam might be better for larger gaps.
 - Check outlets and wall switches on exterior walls. Consider installing gaskets behind plates, caulking around openings and inserting child safety plugs.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY TIP OF THE MONTH

If you recently made or plan to make energy efficiency improvements to your home, you may be eligible for federal tax credits. The Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) of 2022 empowers homeowners to save money on energy efficiency improvements and upgrades. Homeowners can save up to \$3,000 annually to lower the cost of efficiency upgrades by up to 30%.

A few upgrades covered through the IRA include new exterior doors, windows, insulation, heating/cooling equipment and other major appliances. If you completed an upgrade this year or you are considering one, visit **www.energystar.gov/ federal-tax-credits** to learn if you qualify for a tax credit.

MAKE PAYING YOUR ELECTRIC BILL EASY

Sign up today for our Automatic Payment, BudgetWise, and Paperless Billing programs and rest easy knowing your electric bills are taken care of.

AUTOMATIC PAYMENT

Pay your bill automatically from a Credit Card, Debit Card or Bank Account on the 10th, 17th or 24th of each month. Visit www.menard.com/ways-to-pay to download the form.

BUDGETWISE

Sign up for Average Billing or Budget Billing to eliminate large fluctuations in your monthly bills due to season changes.

AVERAGE BILLING: The monthly payment amount is based on a 12-month rolling average use of electricity. This spreads any dramatic changes in bills across several months.

BUDGET BILLING: This sets a specific payment amount based on the past 12 months' usage to be paid each month of the cycle. On the once yearly true-up month (June or November) a credit or additional amount due is applied based on actual electric usage for the cycle.
