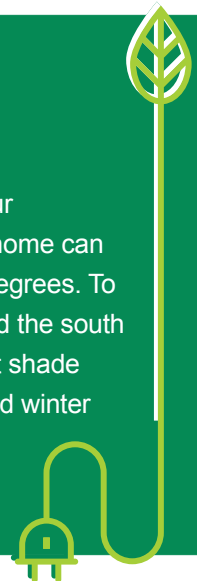

Energy Efficiency Tip of the Month

This planting season, include energy efficiency in your landscaping plans. Adding shade trees around your home can reduce surrounding air temperatures as much as 6 degrees. To block heat from the sun, plant deciduous trees around the south side of your home. Deciduous trees provide excellent shade during the summer and lose their leaves in the fall and winter months, allowing sunlight to warm your home.

Vegetation management for safe service

A Right-of-Way Clearing Q&A with Forester Ross Cloninger

How often does Menard trim trees?

We contract with line clearance certified utility tree companies who work year-round on our property trimming out our right-of-ways. In determining our maintenance cycle, we take into consideration the time it will take to perform as well as the costs affiliated with each substation area. We seek a balance between providing safe, dependable and cost-effective service to the membership. Because of the large territory that we serve, it takes our vegetation crews roughly eight years to complete a full cycle of trimming.

How does Menard determine how much of the tree to trim?

Our crews are directed to follow the American National Standards Institute requirements to assure the continued health of each tree, as well as meet Menard's policy and specifications. There are three main components to take into consideration: the species of tree, how fast that tree will grow, and the location of the trunk in proximity to the power line. Faster growing trees will require more clearance than slower growing trees. Our specifications are to clear the area on either side of our single-phase lines at least 15 feet and three-phase lines at least 25 feet from the center of the pole; this is ground-to-sky clearing. When we cannot achieve adequate clearance against regrowth due to incompatibility with our lines, the vegetation is removed.

Can Menard shape the tree when they trim them to stay clear of power lines?

The directional trimming method or "lateral trimming" removes only the branches that may conflict with the power lines. Rather than cut limbs back to unsightly and unnatural stubs, branches are cut back to the center of the trunk where trees normally shed them. Directional trimmed trees are

less susceptible to disease and insects, and the overall structure of the tree is stronger and more resistant to high winds and ice. Although the shape of the tree has been altered, it is recommended over topping or rounding off trees, which tends to promote quick regrowth of small, weak attached shoots known as "water sprouts."

Should I prune trees myself?

Never under any circumstances should a member attempt to prune trees near high-voltage power lines. Only qualified line clearance certified tree arborists are allowed to work within the minimum approved distance of 10 feet from high voltage lines.

Service lines that deliver electricity from the main power line to the member's meter are not trimmed out by our contractors and are the property owner's responsibility. Please call us to have your service line temporarily disconnected so this work may be done safely by yourself or a qualified tree service.

What trees can I plant close to lines?

Menard Electric requires a minimum of 15 feet of clearance from any woody vegetation. If you wish to plant smaller ornamental trees, we recommend staying at least 25 feet away from any overhead line. Larger trees like oaks and maples require lots of space, so make sure these trees are planted 50 feet away. Same parameters apply for our underground facilities as well. It is very common for homeowners to plant grasses or shrubs around our green underground transformers to cover up the unwanted appearance, but this can obstruct a lineman's ability to work safely if there were to be an issue. Please refer to our vegetation management section on our website before planting.

Why are you applying herbicide?

Herbicides help reduce any evasive woody vegetation that may try and regrow once we have mechanically

trimmed an area. Costs associated with applying herbicide are four times lower than removing vegetation mechanically, which is why it is a crucial and beneficial tool to use. In areas where herbicide may not be desired, such as organic farms or near beehives, we ask that members keep the right-of-way clear.

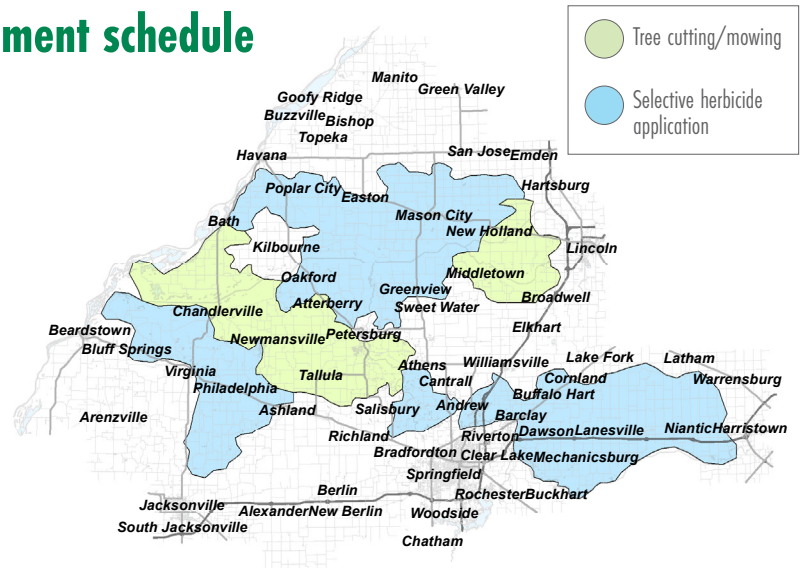
How can I help reduce the frequency of outages caused by trees?

First, understand that our vegetation management plan is an integral part of our goal to provide you with safe, reliable electric service. Second, by allowing our contractor to use the proper trimming techniques, your trees remain healthy, and the regrowth from the tree will tend to sprout away from the power lines. Finally, if you are planting new trees, remember to plant the right tree in the right place, you can find a tree planting zone graphic on our website.

2023 vegetation management schedule

We are partnering with Spoon River Electric Cooperative's forestry department and employ contract crews to cut and mow vegetation on areas shown on the map in green, served by our substations in Petersburg, Middletown and Saidora. Herbicide will be selectively applied to brush as needed in areas that were previously mechanically cleared. In 2023, these areas will include those shown in blue on the map, served by our substations in Poplar City, Mason City, Middletown, Oakford, Virginia, Salisbury, Sherman, Barclay, Mechanicsburg and Lanesville.
