

Rate changes

You may recall in the December issue I discussed the forecasted increase in wholesale power costs. At the time of that publication, we were busy analyzing several potential rate revision models to ensure adequate financial coverage for our forecasted Purchased Power Cost increases and ongoing material cost increases.

Our wholesale power provider, Prairie Power, Inc., was able to provide us with firmer cost increase expectations prior to our November board meeting. At that meeting, your board of directors approved rate adjustments to several of our rate classes. These changes are described below and will appear on your February 2025 billing statement, which collects for January usage.

- The majority of our members (78%) take service in accordance with Rate 10 (Residential) or Rate 17 (Residential with Electric Heat/Geothermal) and will see a \$5 increase in the monthly Facility Charge. As

a reminder, the Facility Charge is a fixed flat charge to provide your service, no matter how much energy you use. Every utility has a similar charge, although it may be identified differently, such as “Customer” or “Service” Charge.

- Rates 10, 17, 20, 30, 31 and 60 will see increases in the Energy charge for kWhs used above the initial tier. Dependent on your electricity usage each month, you may not be affected by this rate structure revision. Of our Rate 10 and Rate 17 residential members, 81% use electricity each month within the initial 1,500 kWh tier and would see no increase whatsoever. Consult the chart on the back side of your bill or view your account online to see your previous monthly kWh usage.
- The monthly fixed charge for our basic Outdoor Light package will increase \$3 per month. If you have a dusk-to-dawn outdoor light with us, this charge is listed as a line item on your billing statement.

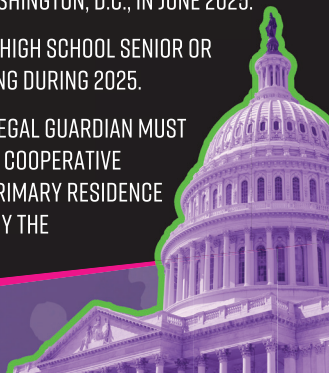

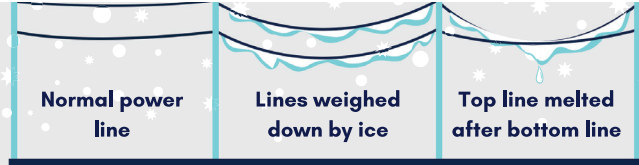

ICE ON POWER LINES IS A WEIGHTY SUBJECT



When it comes to getting electricity across power lines and into homes, ice can be a force to be reckoned with.



ICE ON DISTRIBUTION LINES

Ice can quickly lead to broken power poles and other pole equipment. Ice can also make falling tree branches 30x heavier and much more likely to break power lines.

ON A 300-FOOT SPAN OF 1-INCH-THICK POWER LINES

- 1/2 inch of ice adds 281 pounds of weight
- 1 inch of ice adds 749 pounds of weight
- 2 inches of ice adds 2,248 pounds of weight

WHEN ICE MELTS

Melting ice can cause power outages. If ice on the bottom (neutral) line melts before the lines above, it can cause the lines to touch.

OTHER ICE FACTS

- Damage can begin when ice exceeds 1/4 of an inch
- 1/2 inch of ice can cause a line to sag up to 12 inches
- Pressure can also be caused by a broken tree limb
- Both ice and melting ice can cause power outages

6 Tips for Year-Round ENERGY SAVINGS



1

Use your ceiling fan counterclockwise in the summer for a down breeze, and clockwise in the winter for an updraft to force warm air down into your room.

2

Turn off lights and unplug chargers and electronics when not in use.

3

Regularly change or clean your furnace and indoor AC filters as recommended, and keep the area around your outdoor AC unit clear of obstructions.

4

Close or lower window coverings to keep out heat or cold.

5

Insulate your home and weatherproof windows and doors.

6

Use a programmable or smart thermostat. Adjust the temperature a few degrees for overall savings.

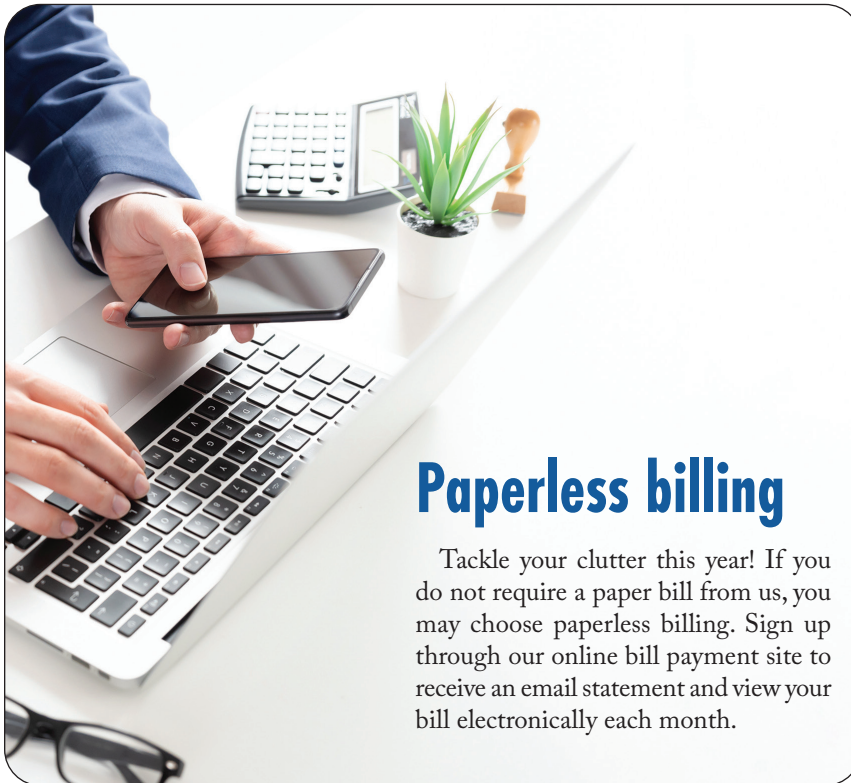
